February 26, 1971

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. in the Fred J. Fredrickson Memorial Library, Bismarck, North Dakota, on February 26, 1971, with Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen presiding.

MINUTES OF DECEMBER 10, 1970 MEETING APPROVED

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the reading of the minutes of the December 10, 1970, meeting be dispensed with and missioner Gray seconded and all members

that they be approved as circulated. Commissioner Gray seconded and all members voted aye.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR JANUARY, 1971

Matt Emerson, Assistant Secretary for the State Water Commission, presented the financial statement for the month

of January, 1971. He stated that the financial statements for the months of November and December, 1970, will be mailed with the minutes of this meeting. Mr. Emerson gave a brief summary of the financial statement for January, 1971. He also stated that the State Auditors have just completed an audit of the State Water Commission records. He indicated that the auditors suggested several recommendations that should be carried out by the Commission, otherwise everything was in order. A report of the audit will be forthcoming, which will be reviewed at a later date. He noted that it was the indication of the auditors

that eventually all state offices should be maintaining their department activities in a like manner. Commissioner Jungroth stated that it was his feeling that we should be very careful about this, as the auditors are to make a subjective determination of the activities and are not to set up the guidelines for the department to follow. For this reason, it would be of much value to make a complete review of our policy to permit us to make a firm policy statement for use by our staff.

After a brief discussion, Commissioner Kramer moved that the financial statement for the month of January, 1971, be accepted as presented. Commissioner Gray seconded and all members voted aye.

CITY OF LAWTON GROUND-WATER STUDY (#1542) Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from Mr. Kenneth E. Loveland, Office Manager, North Central Consultants, Inc., Jamestown, North Dakota, requesting the

State Water Commission to conduct a ground-water study for a water supply for the city of Lawton, North Dakota. The total cost of the study was estimated at \$3,000. The request for State Water Commission participation is for 50 percent of the total cost, an amount not to exceed \$1,500. It was the recommendation of Secretary Hoisveen that the State Water Commission participate in an amount not to exceed \$1,500 for a ground-water study conducted for the city of Lawton.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water Commission participate in a ground-water study for the city of Lawton, North Dakota, in an amount not to exceed 50 percent of the total cost of \$3,000, thus making the State Water Commission participation \$1,500. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

ESTABLISHMENT OF KIDDER COUNTY WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT (#1538)

Secretary Hoisveen informed the Commissioners that several meetings have been held in Kidder County regarding the establishment of a water management district in that county. A petition

has been filed with the State Water Commission requesting the establishment of the water management district embracing Kidder County in its entirety. Notice of Public Hearing was published in the county newspaper and all area newspapers were given a News Release relative to the hearing. Secretary Hoisveen stated that residents of Kidder County are very much in favor of establishing a water management district. It was the recommendation of Secretary Hoisveen that the State Water Commission approve the Order Establishing the Kidder County Water Management District and that a resolution be adopted authorizing this establishment.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water Commission approve the Order Establishing the Kidder County Water Management District and that a resolution be adopted authorizing this establishment. Commissioner Gray seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix 'A')

CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF AMENDMENT TO THE CONTRACT BETWEEN JAMES RIVER IRRIGATION DISTRICT, U.S. BUREAU OF RECLAMATION AND THE GARRISON DIVERSION UNIT (#695) Vice Chairman Richard Gallagher enters

Secretary Hoisveen stated that residents in the James River Irrigation District have approved a plan to serve their lands by a sprinkler irrigation distribution system. A gravity flood system originally had been planned. In order to provide for this change in the plan

to serve the James River Irrigation District lands, a request has been received for approval of an amendment to the contract to which this District is a party with the United States and the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District. Said amendment is as follows:

"Subject to such final location, character, and capacity as is determined by the Contracting Officer and to the extent that funds now or hemafter may be available, the United States will construct distribution works substantially in accordance with the plans set out in Supplemental Report on the Garrison Diversion Unit, November, 1962 (Revised February, 1965) and supporting data thereto, or in accordance with modification of said plans, which modifications are mutually acceptable to the United States, and the Board of Directors of the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, and the Board of Directors of the James River Irrigation District. When the Contracting Officer after consultation with 1-District's Board of Directors shall so notify 1-District in writing, the distribution works shall be deemed to have been completed."

(Underline portions indicate new language or amendment.)

Secretary Hoisveen recommended that the State Water Commission approve the above amendment to the contract.

Commissioner Jungroth moved the approval of a sprinkler irrigation system for the James River Irrigation District lands and also the above amendment to the contract which the James River Irrigation District is a party with the United States and the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

TOLLEY FLATS FLOOD CONTROL (#626)

Secretary Hoisveen stated that Commissioner Kramer was as familar as anyone as to the situation that exists in the

Tolley Flats area. Secretary Hoisveen called upon Commissioner Kramer for a brief report. Commissioner Kramer stated that what this situation amounts to is a hole in the middle of nowhere. Approximately 23,000 acres of land in Ward and Renville Counties have been flooded due to the heavy spring thaws and heavy rain showers of 1969 and 1970. This is not a new problem in this area.

Mr. C. P. Nelson, Drainage Engineer for the North Dakota State Water Commission, has arrived at a partial solution to this problem. A drainage system is proposed that would lead to a coulee for drainage into Lake Darling. With this system, about three feet of water could be drained off this area, thereby permitting many of the landowners to farm their lands. In many cases, farm operators have been unable to obtain access to their farmsteads because of the high water conditions.

The Ward County Water Management District has made a request to the State Water Commission for participation in this project. The Board of County Commissioners of Ward and Renville Counties have approved their respective share of \$110,000. Their request to the State Water Commission is for the amount of \$127,140.

Secretary Hoisveen stated that no bill was introduced in the State Legislature this session for this funding. Secretary Hoisveen recommended to the Commission that the State Water Commission participate in the amount of \$127,140.

Commissioner Kramer moved that the State Water Commission participate in the amount of \$127,140 for a drainage system in the Tolley Flats area. Commissioner Gray seconded and all members voted aye.

COMMISSIONER KRAMER PRESENTED AWARD Secretary Hoisveen informed the group and passed around a newspaper clipping of an honor that had been bestowed upon

one of the Commission members. Congratulations were in order as Commissioner Kramer was the recipient of the Water Master Award given by the North Dakota Irrigation Districts Association. The award is presented annually in recognition of distinguished service in water resource development.

CANDO SOUTHWEST DRAIN (#1532) Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from the city of Cando expressing their appreciation for the State Water Commission and the State Highway Department's

efforts in the project concerning the cleanout of the west ditch of U. S. Highway 281.

GRAND FORKS DRAIN NO. 11 (#1110)

Secretary Hoisveen stated that Grand Forks has proposed a lateral to Grand Forks Drain No. 11. The proposed

lateral is for the purpose of containing and directing excess runoff into the original drain from a critically flat area near the upstream end of the drain, all within the designed drainage area. The Grand Forks County Drain Board has made a request to the State Water Commission for participation in this project.

It is the recommendation of Secretary Hoisveen that the State Water Commission participate 40 percent, not exceeding an amount of \$4,095. The total cost of the project is \$11,247.

Commissioner Gray moved that the State Water Commission participate 40 percent of the total cost, making state participation not to exceed the amount of \$4,095, for the construction of the new lateral to Grand Forks Drain No. 11. Commissioner Jungroth seconded and all members voted aye.

LAKE ENSIGN (#499) Secretary Hoisveen stated that the origin of this dam is unknown, but is probably the work of some early settlers for whom

the lake was named. In 1950, washout of the original fill led to a request from Barnes County for State Water Commission participation rebuilding with a 30-foot gravity-type spillway, which was ignored, and the earthfill was merely replaced with small culverts through it. In a study made in 1969 of the meander level of the lake, it was determined that the meandered elevation was slightly below the 1420 elevation as compared to the original plat acreage and the 1420 elevation shown on the Dazey Quad.

The earthen dam has been rebuilt with rock riprap on the lake side and 4-36"x22" arch culverts set through it, all inverts at 1420.0.

Secretary Hoisveen stated that a request has been received by the Barnes County Commissioners and Water Management District for State Water Commission participation in the project. It is the recommendation of Secretary Hoisveen that the State Water Commission participate in 50 percent of the costs, not to exceed an amount of \$2,334. The total cost of the project is \$4,668.

Commissioner Gray moved that the State Water Commission participate in the restoration of the Lake Ensign Dam to its previous elevation of 1420.0, in an amount not to exceed 50 percent of the total cost, thus making state participation \$2,334. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

FREMONT TOWNSHIP DAM (#1539)

Secretary Hoisveen stated that a request along with a \$200 deposit has been received from the Cavalier County Water

Management District for a study of Fremont Township watershed. He stated that with a slow-release type of a dam, it could be released into the Pembina River into Canada. Secretary Hoisveen recommended that the State Water Commission conduct this study in Fremont Township.

Commissioner Gray moved that the State Water Commission conduct a study of the Fremont Township watershed. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

REPORT ON LEGISLATION

Alan Grindberg, Assistant Chief Engineer for the State Water Commission, reported

on introduced legislation, legislation that has passed one Chamber and is currently in another, and legislation that has been killed, that would be of interest to the members of the Commission during the 42nd Session of the North Dakota State Legislative Assembly.

RETIREMENT CONSIDERATION-MILO W. HOISVEEN Secretary Hoisveen told the Commission of his retirement plans, stating that he was very near to approaching the

time of retirement. He stated that he may be elected President of the National

Water Resources Association in the coming year as he is currently the First Vice President of the Association. If elected President, this office would consume a considerable amount of his time and he would be unable to fulfill two full-time positions.

Vice Chairman Gallagher stated his feelings regarding Secretary Hoisveen's retirement. He stated that he felt that Secretary Hoisveen should retain his position of Chief Engineer-Secretary of the North Dakota State Water Commission while the honor of being President of the National Water Resources Association is carried out. This would mean that Secretary Hoisveen should distribute more of his present workload to his staff, thus making more time for his National Water Resources Association activities.

Secretary Hoisveen told the Commission that this would be considered with his wife and that a report would be made to them in the very near future.

Commissioner Gray moved that consideration of Secretary Hoisveen's retirement be deferred until a later meeting. Commissioner Jungroth seconded and all members voted aye.

Commissioner Jungroth leaves the meeting.

EXPENSES OF SOURIS-RED-RAINY RIVER BASINS COMMISSION ADVISORY COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN Commissioner Gray read a letter from Mr. Gordon Berg, Chairman of the Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District, and also Chairman of the Souris-Red-Rainy

River Basins Commission Advisory Committee. This letter was a request from the Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District to the State Water Commission to reimburse expenses incurred by Mr. Berg for his work on this Advisory Committee. It was stated that Mr. Berg could not incur these expenses justifiably.

After considerable discussion, Commissioner Gray moved the deferrment of this item until further research has been done and upon completion of this research, an agreement will be discussed at a future meeting. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

MERGER OF CHAIN LAKES WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT AND SWEETWATER-DRY LAKE WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT (#704 and 722) Secretary Hoisveen called upon Mr. Cliff Jochim, Special Assistant Attorney General for the State Water Commission, to give a report on the recent request for merging the Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District and the Chain Lakes Water

Management District. Mr. Jochim stated the request was to dissolve the Chain Lakes Water Management District and enlarge the boundaries of the Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District, to include the area of the then dissolved Chain Lakes Water Management District.

Mr. Jochim said that he has had numerous conversations with Mr. Gordon Berg, Chairman of the Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District, and Mr. Frank Foughty, Attorney, Devils Lake, regarding the

merger. On January 26, 1971, Mr. Jochim wrote a letter to Mr. Foughty stating that if the State Water Commission proceeds under Section 61-16-42 of the North Dakota Century Code, as proposed, it will be necessary for the State Water Commission to "find that the reasons for establishing the district no longer exist." In view of the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order issued by the State Water Commission on June 20, 1961, as a result of the petition submitted to it by 50 percent of the freeholders of the Chain Lakes Water Management District requesting the dissolution of the district, which Conclusions of Law stated "the reason for establishing the District does exist and shall continue to exist in the future," it will be very difficult for the State Water Commission to find at this time that such reasons no longer exist.

Mr. Jochim stated if the State Water Commission could find that the reasons for establishing the district no longer exist and the order dissolving the district were issued, the State Water Commission would then find itself in the very awkward position of having to decide if such area should then be included in the Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District. If it approved the petition and included the area which was formerly the Chain Lakes Water Management District into the Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District it would, in effect, be saying that although the reasons for originally establishing the Chain Lakes Water Management District no longer exist some reasons do exist for including the area in another water management district.

Mr. Jochim stated that it was his opinion that the incorporation of these two districts could best be accomplished pursuant to Section 61-16-48. This method of procedure calls for the issuane of one order by the State Water Commission which may be appealed whereas the other method calls for two orders both of which may be appealed. If this is the route (Section 61-16-48, North Dakota Century Code) that is to be followed, it will be necessary to redraft the petition to the State Water Commission.

Commissioner Kramer moved that the above recommendation (Section 61-16-48, North Dakota Century Code) be followed. Commissioner Gray seconded and all members voted aye.

SHEEP CREEK DAM (#1358)

At 11:00 a.m., the Grant County Water Management District appeared before the Commission. The following made the

appearance: Harry Zacher, Chairman; William Lince, Albert Rivinius, and Herbert Leer, all of Elgin, North Dakota. Mr. Zacher was the spokesman for the group. He invited the Commission to be present for the dedication of the completion of the Sheep Creek Dam at 2:30 p.m. on June 4, 1971. Governor Guy has accepted an invitation to present an address at the dedication. He also invited the Commission to hold a Commission meeting at this time, if they would prefer.

Vice Chairman Gallagher thanked the Grant County Water Management District Board for the invitation and assured them that they would be present.

REPORT ON U.S. BUREAU OF RECLAMATION PROJECTS IN NORTH DAKOTA - PRESENTATION BY THEODORE E. MANN Mr. Theodore E. Mann, Projects Manager for the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation, Mr. Gisli Freeman, Assistant Projects Manager and Mr. Robert McCullough both of the Bureau, made an appearance before the Commission. Mr. Mann was the spokesman for the group. He gave the Commission a brief report on the projects that the Bureau was working on. He noted that the Garrison Diversion project was now eight percent complete. It will take approximately 10-12 years to totally complete it. The original plan was to gravity irrigate the lands, but now the plans have been changed to the sprinkler type irrigation. Three construction contracts have been awarded on the Garrison Diversion project: 1) Snake Creek Pumping Plant - 45 percent complete, scheduled for completion in 1974; 2) McClusky Canal - 1st section contract was awarded to William Clairmont for \$8 million in March, 1970. To date, this is about 27 percent complete and 1973 is the scheduled completion date. 3) Reach C of the Canal was awarded to the Oil Field Service Company, Inc., Tioga, North Dakota in June, 1970, for \$2.9 million. To date, this Reach is approximately 11 percent complete. The project is scheduled for completion in 1972. To date, about \$20 million worth of contracts have been awarded. The total estimated construction cost is \$284 million.

Mr. Mann then showed the Commission members some very interesting slides taken at the Snake Creek Pumping Plant. The slides showed scenes from the groundbreaking to the completion of the project.

Following the slides, Mr. Mann gave a brief report on some of the future projects for the Bureau. He then posted a map on the blackboard of the Bureau of Reclamation's proposed West River Diversion Study. He briefly explained the proposal to the Commission. This would be a pipeline diversion. The Bureau of Reclamation made a request to the State Water Commission for some type of a written statement, be it either in resolution form or just letter form, expressing their desire for such a project. The Bureau will be presenting this proposal in Washington, D. C. the following week and would like some form of state approval of the project.

Vice Chairman Gallagher thanked the Bureau of Reclamation representation for making their presentation.

A discussion was held on Theodore E. Mann's presentation to the Commission regarding the West River Diversion Study. The State Water Commission has already made studies in this same respect and the State Water Commission expects to be the lead agency in a project of this type.

L.S. FOOTE WATER PERMIT (#782)

Cliff Jochim reported on the L.S. Foote Water Permit. The U. S. Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife petitioned the

State Water Commission to cancel the North Dakota Industrial Commission held permit. The State Water Commission, after holding a hearing on the petition, issued its order refusing to cancel the permit. The Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife appealed the State Water Commission's decision and the District Court, in its decision ordered the State Water Commission to declare the permit cancelled and forfeited. The question the State Water Commission must now decide is: should it appeal the District Court's decision to the North Dakota Supreme Court?

Mr. Jochim and Jon Kerian, Minot's Assistant City Attorney, have reviewed and discussed in depth, the facts of the case and cannot think of any new approach to take nor any substantial law that hasn't

already been argued. In their opinion, it is very doubtful that the Supreme Court would even accept the appeal and if it should, it is highly unlikely the appeal would be successful. They recommended the case be dropped and not appealed.

Commissioner Kramer moved that the State Water Commission accept the above recommendation. Commissioner Gray seconded and all members voted aye.

REPORT ON PROGRESS OF SHEYENNE RIVER DIVERSION PROJECT - COMMISSIONER GRAY (#599)

Commissioner Gordon Gray presented a brief report to the Commission on the progress of the Sheyenne River Diversion. The present proposed plan calls for a combination bridge and dam across the

Sheyenne River on what is now a township road on the border between Stanley and Barnes Township one mile suth of Cass County Road 8. When water behind the dam reaches a certain level it would flow into a ditch running east into Cass County Drain 27, which in turn runs east into Rose Coulee and finally into the Red River.

At a recent County Commissioners meeting, Mayor Herschel Lashkowitz asked the Cass County Commissioners for cost sharing participation in the proposed Sheyenne River Diversion project. Efforts are also being made to obtain Fargo's membership in the Southeast Cass County Water Management District. Secretary Hoisveen suggested that Cliff Jochim make further studies of Fargo's joining with the Southeast Cass County Water Management District. He also suggested that the State Water Commission must layout the plan for the Sheyenne River Diversion and present it to the city, as it is apparent that the State Water Commission will be approached for a share of the cost participation.

SHEYENNE RIVER SNAGGING AND CLEARING PROJECT (#568)

Secretary Hoisveen stated that Cass County is again working on snagging and clearing of the Sheyenne River. Nine miles have been completed on this

project. Work is being done at \$500 per mile. Secretary Hoisveen recommended that the Commission approve snagging and clearing operations on the Sheyenne River from the Richland-Cass County line to the confluence of the Red River.

Commissioner Gray moved the authorization of the snagging and clearing operations on the Sheyenne River from the Richland-Cass County line to the confluence of the Red River at a rate of \$500 per mile. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

MICHIGAN DRAIN (#1534)

Secretary Hoisveen said that a request had been received from the Nelson County Water Management District for State Water

Commission approval to hold a public hearing on a proposal to construct a drainage ditch beginning at the reservoir, east of the city of Michigan, then proceeding in a northwesterly direction terminating at Lake Laretta. This would eliminate the serious drainage problem that is confronting the city of Michigan. It was

the recommendation of Secretary Hoisveen that the State Water Commission approve this proposal for the city of Michigan.

Commissioner Gray moved that the State Water Commission approve the proposed plans for a drainage system for the city of Michigan. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

LAND NEGOTIATIONS, LAKE ALICE AREA (#416)

Secretary Hoisveen stated that the local landowners in the Lake Alice area have agreed to sell their land to the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife at an

agreeable price. Mr. and Mrs. Elsperger, who are large landowners in the area, first believed that there should be a firmer guarantee of compliance on the part of the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, but now have agreed to the Bureau's option of 18 months. Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from Mrs. Elsperger expressing their thanks to the State Water Commission for arranging a meeting with representatives of the Bureau.

Secretary Hoisveen stated that the only action that the Commission might take at this time is lending its voice in aiding the Government in making a decision. It seems that this will always be a problem area and by the landowners agreeing to sell their land, it will improve relations with the county and the district.

WATER PERMITS NOS. 1649, 1743, 1745, 1746 and 1747

Secretary Hoisveen presented five water permits to the Commission for consideration. It was the recommendation of the State

Engineer that these water permits be approved.

It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Gray and carried that the five Conditional Permits be approved, subject to such conditions as indicated on the permit. (See Appendix "B")

AMERICAN WATER RESOURCES ASSOCIATION

Secretary Hoisveen explained the organization of the American Water Resources Association to the Commissioners. He

stated that this is a scientific organization dedicated to the advancement of water resources research, planning, development, management and education through its meetings and publications. He also stated that there were membership dues of \$75. He asked the Commission if it was their consensus of joining this organization.

Commissioner Gray moved that the State Water Commission join the American Water Resources Association, paying the \$75 membership dues. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

meeting was adjourned at 1:25 p.m.

RESOLUTION 71-3-292

Authorizing the Establishment of Kidder County Water Management District

WHEREAS, Kidder County, North Dakota, acting by and through its Board of County Commissioners, on the 30th day of December, 1970, filed with the North Dakota State Water Commission its petition requesting the establishment of a water management district embracing the territory within Kidder County; and

WHEREAS, the report of the Chief Engineer of this Commission and the facts adduced at a public hearing held in the Kidder County Courthouse on the 22nd day of January, 1971, disclosed that the investigation, regulation and conservation of water-bearing aquifers within Kidder County can best be accomplished by a water management district in cooperation with state and federal agencies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the North Dakota State Water Commission, in meeting duly assembled this 26th day of February, 1971, in Bismarck, North Dakota, do hereby authorize and direct the Chairman and Secretary of this Commission to execute an Order establishing a water management district embracing the territory within Kidder County and designated the Kidder County Water Management District.
